UNSW Short Course - Rural Strategic Planning

Michelle successfully completed a Rural Strategic Planning course run by the University of NSW in Tamworth in October 2005 and February 2006. The course was a useful refresher on strategic plan making, planning law and public consultation formats and skills.

On the subject of rural planning, Michelle appreciated hearing an address (broadcast on ABC Radio) by Mick Keogh, Executive Director of the Australian Farm Institute on 14 March 2006 to policymakers. Mick challenged policymakers to ensure their policies to protect agricultural land had not been formed in isolation of Australian agricultural and market realities. The key point from Mick Keogh's address was:

"The broad domestic and international marketplace is the key determinant of change in agriculture, and to presume to plan the future of farming in isolation from that reality will turn agriculture into some sort of historic relic, snap-frozen in time and sustained only by ever-increasing public funding." Mick Keogh, Executive Director – Australian Farm Institute

So avoid over-prescribed, poorly conceived and inflexible rural planning policies which prevent landholders from adapting to the international and domestic marketplace. At the same time, if something is truly worth preserving – go for it!
